PLASTIC POLLUTION

About 71 percent of Earth is covered by water. A lot of plastic gets into the world's oceans each year. People who study plastic waste think between 8.8 million and 20 million tons (8 million and 18.1 million mt) of plastic winds up in the oceans every year.

An item that a person only uses once before throwing it away is called a single-use item. Plastic bottles, straws, and bags are all single-use items. About 40 percent of all plastic waste is single-use items.

Plastic has started to clump together in the oceans. In 1997, a sailor named Charles Moore discovered the **Great Pacific Garbage Patch** between Hawaii and California. Today, about 87,000 tons (79,000 mt) of plastic are in the Great Pacific Garbage Patch. Most of it is old fishing gear.
